

Waste (Degradable and Non-degradable) Management Policy

This policy aims to manage degradable and non-degradable waste generated on campus to minimize environmental impact and promote sustainability.

Main objectives

1. Reduce waste generation at the source.
2. Segregate waste into degradable and non-degradable categories.
3. Promote recycling and reuse of materials.
4. Ensure proper disposal of waste in compliance with environmental regulations.

Policy Guidelines

1. Waste Segregation

Training sessions will be organized to educate the campus community about the importance of waste management and the procedures to be followed. Regular audits will be conducted to assess waste generation, segregation, and disposal practices. Feedback from the campus community will be solicited to identify areas for improvement. The policy will be reviewed and updated periodically to incorporate best practices and technological advancements in waste management.
